Trek 2000 is a Singapore company that is essentially the inventor of the ubiquitous USB flash memory based thumb drive, and hence held the worldwide trademark: ThumbDrive. During the ceremony, Trek 2000 will also give a technical presentation on its latest innovation, the FluCard technology.

After several rounds of lengthy discussions, we have managed to focus the scope of the conference to four main areas. Those are: (i) Basic Technologies for Consumer Electronics, (ii) Key Entertainment and Information Systems, (iii) Consumer Electronics for Health-care & Wellness, and (iv) Enabling Technologies. All these areas were finally split into twenty two tracks covering the most popular aspects and emerging areas of interest to the community of engineers and researchers of consumer electronics. We feel fortunate to have had the cooperation of highly motivated track chairs for all the tracks, and take this opportunity to thank all of them for their efforts in coordinating the review process on time.

We are happy that ISCE this year had a good number of paper submissions from over 20 different countries. The detailed list of papers submitted from different countries is given in the table next page. After completion of the reviews, we have accepted about 50% out of more than 200 submissions for oral presentation. The technical program of ISCE 2011 includes three keynote addresses by very eminent speakers along with twenty four lecture sessions and three poster sessions spanning the first three days of the conference. On the last day of ISCE 2011, we have a high-quality tutorial on "Grounding: The Grounds for EMC Design", by Elya Joffe, President Elect of IEEE Product Safety Engineering Society, before the valediction.

We want to express our sincere gratitude to all the members of the organizing committee for working together and for their dedicated help in the last one year to make ISCE 2011 successful. We also thank our colleagues at the School of Computer Engineering of Nanyang Technological University and the Institute for Infocomm Research, Singapore for their active support. We would not have been able to form this technical program without the timely help of our program committee members who have carefully reviewed all the submissions in spite of their busy schedules. The last but not the least, we must express our sincere thanks to our webmaster Ang Ah Giat, Linda for her untiring service to make the whole review process smooth and successful.
